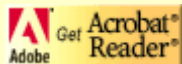

2006 FAMILY CAMPING FEES*

If entire fee is paid by May 15th:

- **\$22** age 18+
- **\$19** age 11-17
- **\$16** age 6-10
- **\$10** age 3-5
- **FREE** age 2 & under
- **MAXIMUM FEE** per family (parents or guardians and children) is **\$80**

If fee is paid after May 15th:

- **\$27** age 18+
- **\$24** age 11-17
- **\$21** age 6-10
- **\$15** age 3-5
- **FREE** age 2 & under
- **NO** maximum fee per family

***Fee includes 3 meals:**

Saturday Lunch, Saturday Dinner, and Sunday Breakfast.
